The weather was kind to us yesterday, so Years 4,5 & 6 were able to enjoy their sports day. Thank you to all family members who came to support.

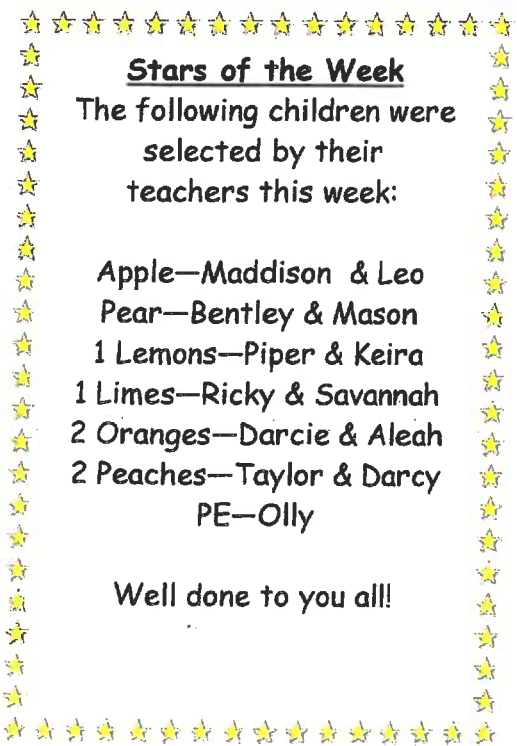
 **TOP CLASS**
